The AACRN, administered by the National Park Service, recognizes sites, programs, and facilities that have played a pivotal role in the African American civil rights movement. PROPA's inclusion in this prestigious network highlights its ongoing efforts to celebrate and preserve the rich cultural contributions of the African Diaspora in Puerto Rico through traditional practices and the arts.

"We are honored to be part of the African American Civil Rights Network and to be the first organization to represent Puerto Rico in this historic group," said Melanie Maldonado, President of PROPA. Through its diverse programming, including the biennial *Bomba Research Conference* and the *Lugares Históricos* program (both of which are based in Puerto Rico), annual *Areito* series and other educational initiatives, PROPA continues to inspire and engage audiences while promoting ancestral pride and cultural resilience.

The inclusion in the AACRN will enable PROPA to collaborate with other network members, share resources, and participate in national initiatives to advance civil rights education and awareness. This partnership will also enhance PROPA's ability to reach broader audiences and deepen its impact within the community.
